Vocational School Mikolongwe

The Vocational School aims at equipping young men and women with technical skills and knowledge as well as life skills for them to become productive youths and be able to secure employment or become self-reliant by starting up small- scale businesses, thereby alleviating poverty.

The Vocational School started its operation in Malawi in 1997 in Chiradzulu district and is registered and accredited by TEVET Authority under Ministry of Labour, Youth Sports and Manpower Development. The courses offered are: Carpentry & Joinery, Plumbing and WASH tech, Bricklaying & Plastering, Tailoring, Textile & Fashion Designing, Welding and Fabrication, Certificate in Financial Accounting, Community Development, Agriculture, Beauty & Hairdressing, and Cobbler & Shoe Making. Over 10,300 young people have graduated from the various courses over the years.

DAPP Teacher Training in Malawi

DAPP Malawi continues to work with the Government of Malawi through the Ministry of Education Science and Technology in its efforts to improve the standards of education in Malawi by training committed and multi-skilled teachers especially those that will make impact in rural areas.

The Teacher Training program in Malawi aims at improving quality education and creating employment for youth in the rural areas of Malawi thereby contributing to the Government of Malawi's efforts to achieve the Malawi Growth and Development Strategy (MGDS III) and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In 2018, DAPP graduated 324 student teachers who are ready to teach in rural primary schools.
